PLAY ON TEXTURES by Anne de Villeméjane


## How would one describe Anne de Villeméjane's style? She would say that "womanhood and poetry deriving from the rawest of materials" creates her


style. Despite their slender form, Anne de Villeméjane's sculptures include complex heterogeneous textures as well as a multitude of abstract traces. From the raw feel of cement to the transparency of acrylic, the artist uses different techniques to create a modern industrial feel or a jewelry-like finish. As the viewers get close to the sculpture, they will experience the near-hypnotic, textured finish made up of metal grids, washers, wires, and nails of all sorts. When they move around the piece, however, the figurine comes to life. The threshold between the sculpture's world and their's becomes very thin. "We have a need for serenity and calm, especially now. These sculptures radiate


this state of mind. They are delicate and powerful at the same time."


Déesse, Bronze sculpture

Anne de Villeméjane's journey as a sculptor started in 2000 when she met the Italian

sculptor Lorenzo Cascio. Cascio noticed the textural quality of her paintings, and he

incited her to try a new challenge and take on sculpture. Her work underwent

metamorphosis, as the figures previously seen in her paintings found new life in

sculpture. Cast in bronze or built in cement, they found their rightful expression in


a three dimensional physicality. Finally, Villeméjane's imprint on the sculpture's

surface and her feminine poetry become fully distinguishable.

Her sculptures are part of private collections around the world, and have been

shown in exhibitions and art fairs in New York, Miami, San Francisco, Paris and


